On the grid, draw each rectangle, label it with the numbers, and find its area.

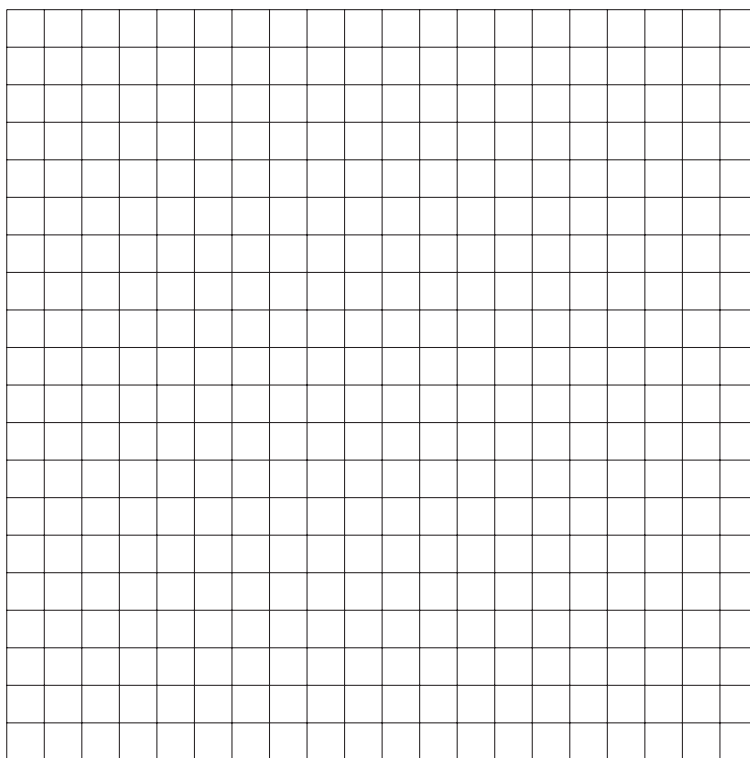
a. 3×4
