Activity 1

How Many Apples?

Solve each problem. Show your thinking using objects, a drawing, or a diagram.

1. A worker packs 20 apples in 4 boxes. She packs the same number of apples in each box. How many apples are in each box?
2. A worker packs 36 apples in 6 boxes. He packs the same number of apples in each box. How many apples are in each box?

3. A worker packs 45 apples in 9 boxes. She packs the same number of apples in each box. How many apples are in each box?

Activity 3

All the Apples

A farmer puts 24 apples in boxes. She puts 8 apples in each box. How many boxes are there?

- How are they different?
- What is alike and what is different about how these problems are represented and solved?
