



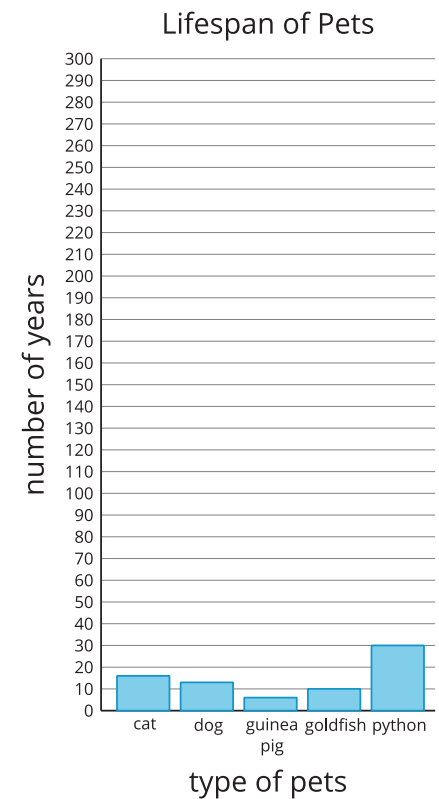
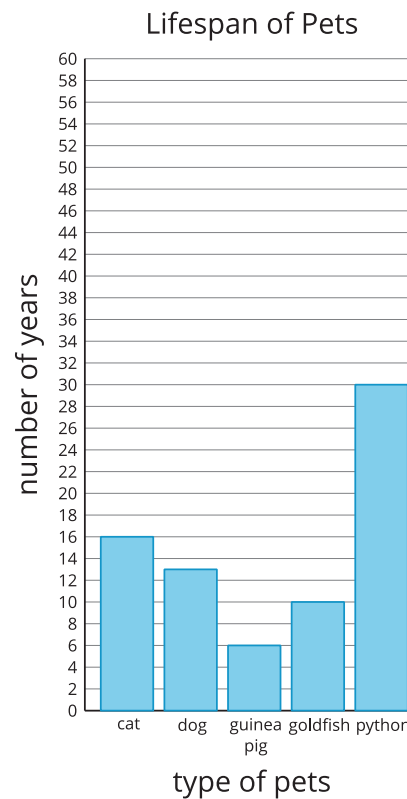
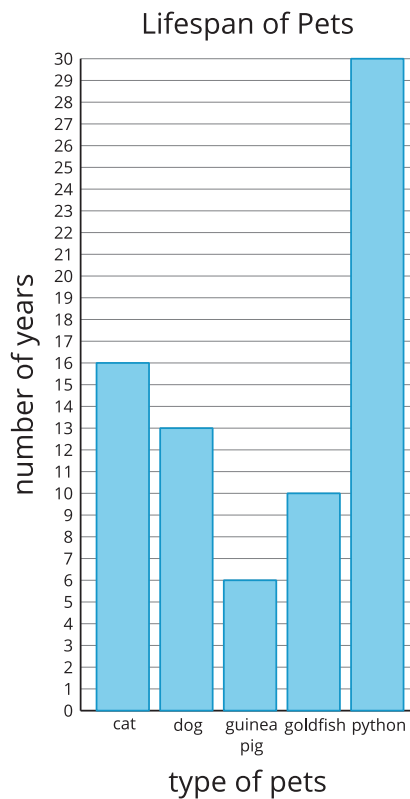

Notice and Wonder: Bar Graph Scales

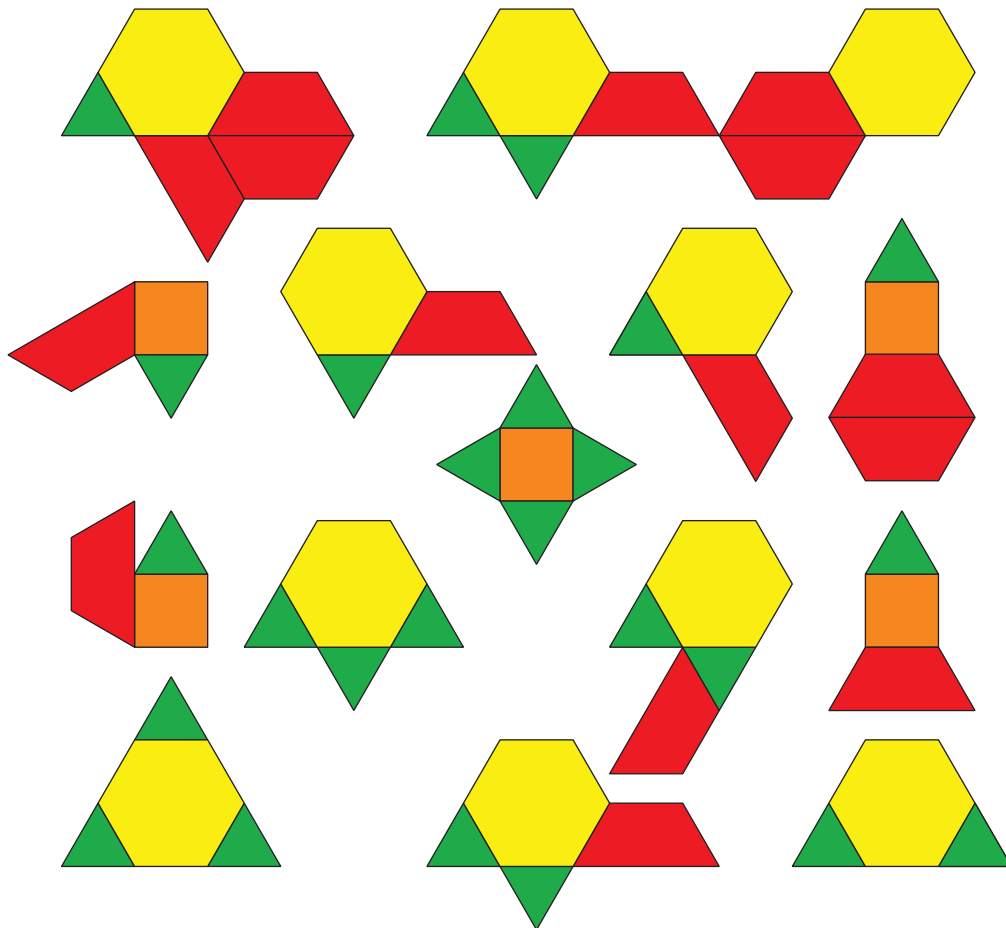
What do you notice? What do you wonder?



Activity 1

Represent Pattern Blocks

Here is a collection of pattern blocks.



Mai, Noah, and Priya want to make a bar graph to represent the number of triangles, squares, trapezoids, and hexagons in the collection.

- Mai says the scale of the bar graph should be 2.
- Noah says the scale of the bar graph should be 5.
- Priya says the scale of the bar graph should be 10.

1. Who do you agree with? Explain your reasoning.

2. Use the scale that you chose to create a scaled bar graph to represent the collection.
