



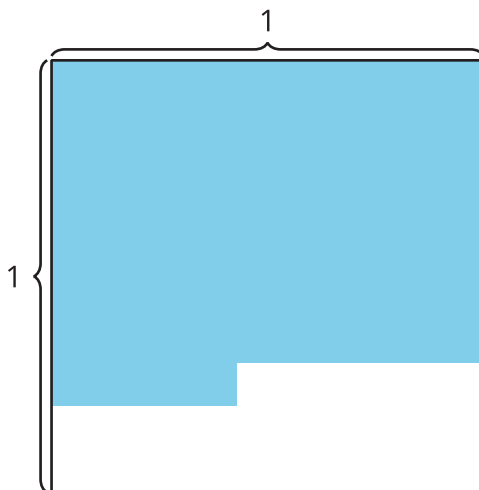
Thousandths on Diagrams and in Words

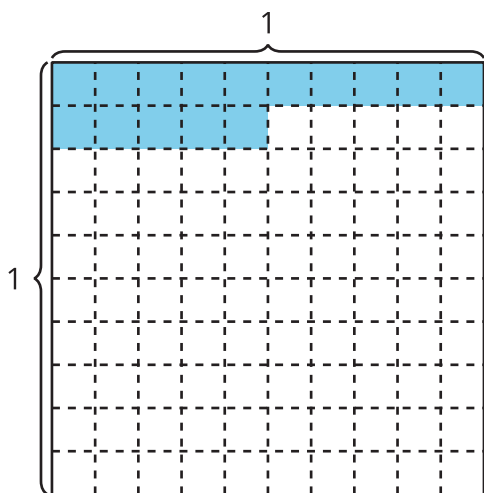
3. Shade the diagram to represent 0.328. Explain or show your reasoning.
