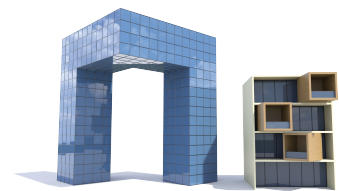

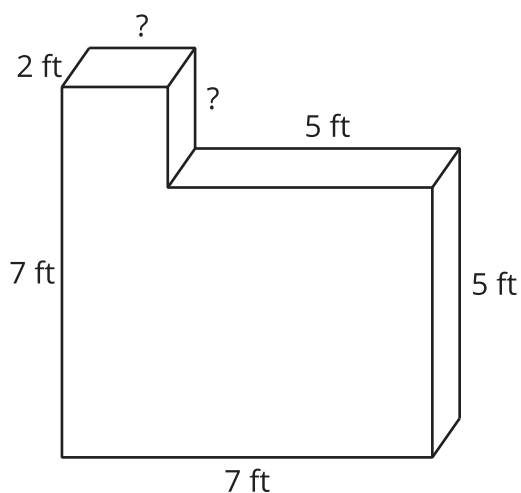

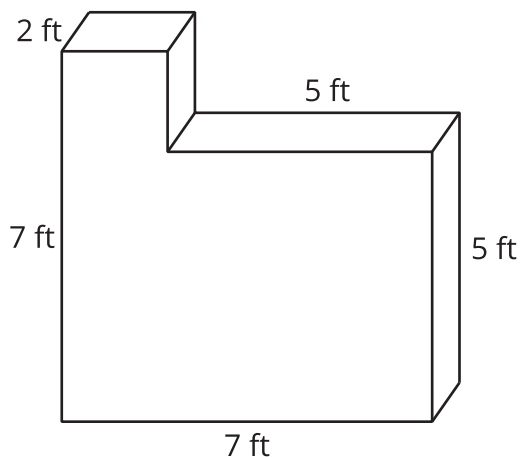

## Find the Volumes of Figures



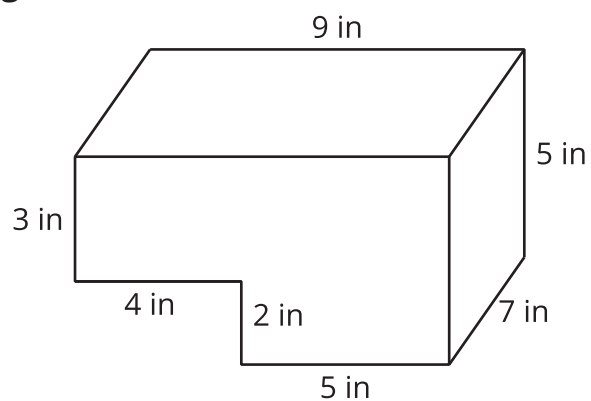
Partner A: Find the volume of Figure 1.

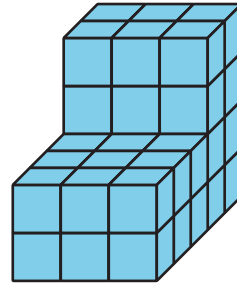


## Activity 2

1. Explain how each expression represents the volume of the figure. Show your reasoning. Organize your work so it can be followed by others.

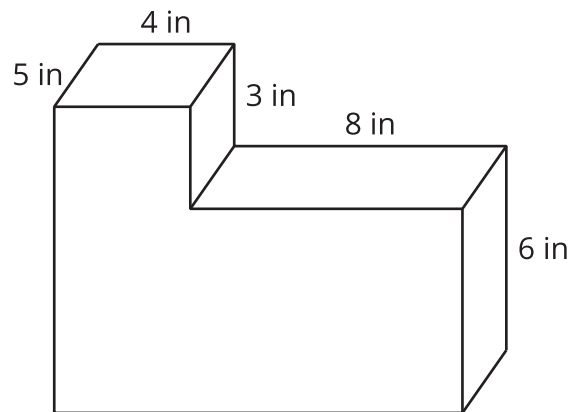
a.  $((2 \times 3) \times 4) + ((3 \times 3) \times 2)$

b.  $(5 \times 4 \times 3) + (5 \times 12 \times 6)$  cubic inches
