






Activity 1

My Rectangle Art

 - at least 6 multiples of a number
 - prime numbers
 - composite numbers
 - b. Explain or show your reasoning.
2. Turn your grid paper over and trace your design with a black marker or crayon. Color the design to emphasize the choices you made and give your artwork a title.
