Worked Example: Solving Equations

Solve the equation $-(3x - 7) = -5$ for x .

Step 1:

$$\begin{aligned} -(3x - 7) &= -5 \\ -3x + 7 &= -5 \end{aligned}$$

Step 2:

$$\begin{aligned} -3x + 7 &= -5 \\ -3x + 7 - 7 &= -5 - 7 \\ -3x &= -12 \end{aligned}$$

Step 3:

$$\begin{aligned} -3x &= -12 \\ x &= 4 \end{aligned}$$
